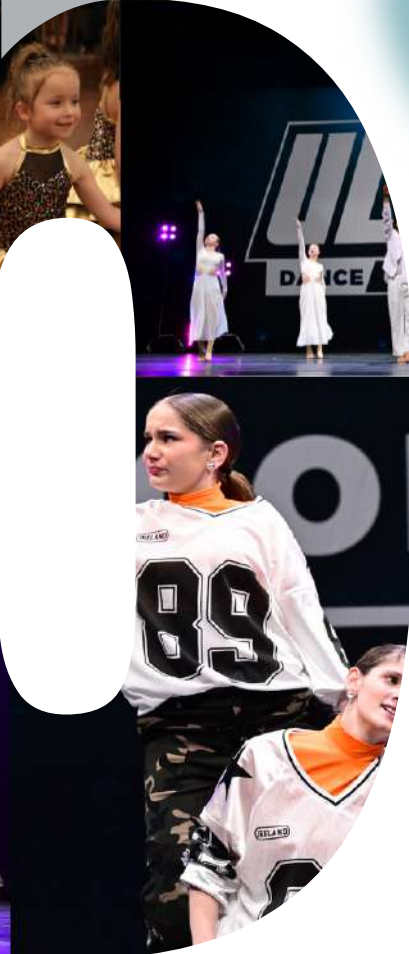


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1. Welcome to Encore!

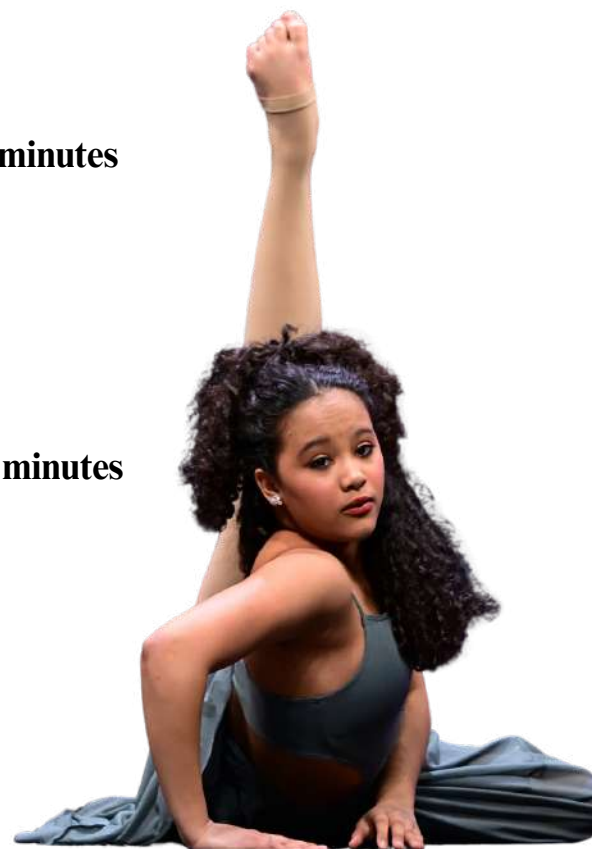

A dance convention is a one day event in which dancers can attend dance workshops of various styles, taught by master teachers from across the country. The diverse group of master teachers provide students with the opportunity to learn and grow in a nurturing, high energy environment.

*Not only will your dancers benefit from learning from other teachers, but they will also learn **WITH** other students from all over!*

10. What are my additional Fees?

Although tuition is all inclusive and we work to make it an easy process for all families, there are additional fees when joining our competitive team. Please see below:

- **Summer Dance Intensives**--Encore is offering two dance intensives this summer at \$610 per week.
- **Summer GROUP DANCE Rehearsals & Choreography**--Competitive dance team members get a head start on 26-27 season with pre-season Summer Group Dance Rehearsals to learn your routines. A survey will be sent to schedule these rehearsals around your August conflicts, with a separate fee to cover these additional sessions. This early bird prep will boost your choreography knowledge, teamwork, and confidence before the regular season kicks off! Please note that the Summer Study fee is separate from the Summer Intensive fee. Summer Intensives are two one-week programs, whereas Summer Study is the designated time for learning group competition choreography.
 - \$175 per dancer for Mini Echo Dancers & Performance Petites
 - \$375 per dancer for Elite, Elite Jr. & Echo Group Dances
 - \$315 per dancer for Epic Group Dances
- **Private Lesson Fees**--Dancers who compete in a solo, duo and/or trio will have a weekly 30 minute private lesson. These classes can be paid for by class pack or individually. Class packs will be automatically renewed after the end of the previous pack, unless communicated otherwise. These dancers will get scheduled lessons prior to Sept. as well which are NOT included in the group summer study fee. Private lessons are required weekly from September through the final competition of the season, continuing through the recital for all duos and trios.
- **Competition Fees**--Dance competitions charge an entry fee per routine. This fee goes directly to the competition organizer and covers the cost of running the event. The total amount you pay depends on how many dances you enter. The total cost depends on entries. Remember, these are estimates and may vary by competition. Competition fees are set directly by the event organizers. Because these costs vary by event and specific inclusions, we can only provide estimated price ranges at this time. Please note that these estimates are subject to change, and final totals will be confirmed once official registration is complete.
 - \$65-\$95 per dancer for group dances
 - \$85-\$105 per dancer for duos/trios
 - \$120-\$220 per dancer for solos
- **Convention Fee**--The dance convention fee, at about \$200-\$250 goes directly to the convention organizer, covers your dancer's entire day of workshops, classes from renowned instructors, performance opportunities, and helps run the event with venue rentals and staff. It's an investment in their dance development and a fun way to experience the dance world!
- **Performance Tickets**--While our tuition is all-inclusive, please note that tickets for the Winter Gala, Competition Showcase, and Year-End Recital are sold separately. - **Costumes**-- All required team group dance costumes are included in your annual tuition! For our Elite, Elite Jr., and Echo teams, this covers your three core routines (one large group and two small groups). Please note that any costumes for additional group dances beyond the requirements, as well as trios, duos, or solos, will be billed separately.

12. What else do I need to know about the Competition Experience?

- **Costume and Music Selection--** Costume design and musical selection decisions are made solely by Encore Center for Performing Arts staff. Solo costumes will be confirmed with the dancer and dancer's family before ordering. Solo music will also be discussed with the dancer and family before finalizing a song. Options may be given; however, the final decision is made by Encore, as all are a representation of the studio itself.
- **Placement--**By making a request, this does not mean your dancer will automatically be given one of these additional dances. By requesting a duet or trio, you are agreeing to accept the partner and routine selected for you. No changes will be made after announcements are made. Based on your dancer's audition, teacher availability and style of assigned routine, your dancer will be assigned a choreographer and private lesson teacher. Once assigned, your private lesson teacher will collaborate closely with the choreographer to maintain the original vision. They also have the creative freedom to make minor adjustments to the choreography to ensure the piece is polished and best suits the dancers' growth.
- **Solos, Duos & Trios: (Elite, Epic, Epic Jr. Elite Jr. & Echo ONLY)--**If granted a solo, duet, or trio, you would be required to have a weekly 30 min private lesson for each solo, duet, or trio routine you are part of.
- **AWARD CEREMONIES--**Award ceremonies are usually held a few times each day of competitions, and are the MOST FUN time of the weekend! Team Members are required to wear studio branded attire on stage for ALL award ceremonies that they attend. Team Members are required to attend all award ceremonies for the dances that they are a part of, but are also allowed, and often enjoy, to go on stage for other award ceremonies to support their teammates.
 - Awards are the time to:
 - Hoot and holler (parents AND dancers)
 - Take pictures
 - Sit back and relax!



12. What else do I need to know about the Competition Experience?

The most important thing to remember about awards is that ALL scores are the opinions of 3 or 4 judges.

"A dance competition is the way a certain set of judges view a certain set of dancers on a certain day. If we had done this competition yesterday, or if one of the judges had been someone else, chances are the results would in some way be different. It is good that we compete as dancers, because we compete every day in life. Competitions help to show us where we have been, where we are now, and where we have to aim to go in the future. But it is important to remember that the true worth of anyone, as a dancer or person, will never be measured by a trophy or cash prize."

All solid colored leotard with black shorts, tights & ballet skirt for ballet.

Hair sprayed back in a high ponytail, or for boys, slicked back.

Mini Echo Class/Rehearsal

All solid colored leotard with black shorts.

Hair sprayed back in a high ponytail, or for boys, slicked back.

Epic Team Rehearsals:

All black t-shirt and joggers or leggings with White Nike AF1 Sneakers.

Hair sprayed back in a high ponytail or for boys, slicked back.

Electric & Elevate Apprentice:

Black leotard with blue skirt (skirt provided)

Hair pulled away from face.

Ballet: Solid colored leotard, tights and skirt. (NO SHORTS/ additional layers)

Jazz: Solid colored leotard, tights and shorts.

Lyrical: Solid colored leotard, tights and shorts.

No additional layers are permitted in classes, as dancers will get warm right away and it is important for us to see lines.

*No chunky jewelry.

Advanced Programs Policies

- Dancers in Epic, Epic Jr. Elite, Elite Jr., Echo, Mini Echo, & Performance Petites are required and expected to commit to the entire year of dance classes. If a dancer decides to drop from the competition team, tuition will still be charged for the remainder of the year, unless in the case of an emergency.
- Dancers on any of our Competitive Dance Teams, (Epic, Epic Jr., Elite, Elite Jr., Echo, Mini Echo, & Performance Petites) are only permitted 4 unexcused team rehearsal absences throughout the year. We understand emergencies and illnesses arise so please always communicate with us. Attendance will be carefully monitored by our teachers, and you will receive a monthly report detailing your attendance status. Punctuality is crucial. Team members must arrive on time and be fully prepared to participate at the designated start time.
- Unexcused absences include, but are not limited to: skipping practices, rehearsals, or performances without a valid reason, or failing to provide timely notification. Excessive unexcused absences may result in disciplinary action.
- For prompt communication, please reach our teachers through the studio phone 914-730-1122, studio email (info@encorecenterperformingarts.com), or schedule a meeting. We kindly ask that you avoid contacting teachers on their personal devices. Urgent concerns? Contact the studio directly. This supports teacher work-life balance and focused attention for your child. - We expect our advanced program dancers to trust the Artistic Directors' choices regarding casting, development, and presentation. Their decisions align with our studio values and benefit everyone involved.
- You'll be entrusted with your complete competition attire, including the costume, dance shoes, and any competition-specific accessories like earrings and headpieces. Remember, these items are vital for a cohesive performance. To ensure a smooth season for everyone, lost or damaged costumes and accessories will be your responsibility to replace. However, costume stock and specific accessories might be limited.
- **ECPA IS A DRAMA FREE ZONE.** We expect all of our advanced level dancers and parents / guardians to set an example for our studio with a positive attitude, sportsmanship and kindness to ALL dancers, families & performers in the studio.
- We foster a positive environment where everyone feels valued. Gossip, bullying, and negativity are not tolerated in any form. We address disrespectful behavior promptly to ensure everyone's enjoyment and growth.
- Our priority is to create a positive and stable environment where all our dancers can flourish. To support this, we ask that parents consistently model respectful behavior and maintain a cooperative dynamic, especially in the presence of the team. We recognize that personal matters may occur, but we strongly encourage that any issues between parents be kept separate from the team environment and resolved privately. This allows our dancers to focus on their training and teamwork without unnecessary distractions or stress.
- Maintaining a positive and respectful team environment is essential for everyone's enjoyment and success. If multiple concerns arise regarding a dancer's behavior that negatively impacts others, we will reach out to discuss these observations and collaboratively develop strategies to support more positive interactions. Repeated instances of negative behavior will lead to disciplinary action and may result in dismissal from the team.
